The Dubuque Dream Center was established in July 2013 to build on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's Dream by embracing, empowering, and unifying our community across racial and socioeconomic lines. The Dream Center is designed to provide programs that address the social, academic, and economic needs of youth and families in a coordinated, systematic structure.

School Connectors are Dream Center direct service staff who are trained in reading prescriptions and math improvement strategies utilized by area educators. School Connectors provide hands-on support for students and Dream Center Academy Teachers in the classroom.

BECOME A DREAM MAKER

Funding for Dubugue Dream Center Academy does not cover after school and summer fees. We need the community's help in making the dreams of the children we serve come true. We are asking you to become a Dream Maker!

A Dream Maker is an individual or organization that desires to see a student reach their fullest potential by sponsoring their tuition costs related to the holistic services they receive at the Dubuque

Dream Center. This system is designed to help support low-income families that do not qualify for DHS child care assistance and cannot afford the costs of the program, but have ambitions of seeing their children succeed in life.

Our Annual Student Sponsorship Campaign runs from October– December each year to ensure student fees are covered for the following year. Student Sponsorship funds cover after school & summer programming for families unable to afford the program but do not qualify for Child Care Assistance through the State of Iowa.
